Laborers for a Plentiful Harvest

One year ago, The Baptist Children's Village launched its Youth Detention Intervention Program (YDIP). In talking with now YDIP Director Darron Byrd, leadership was stunned to learn that there are 17 youth detention facilities in Mississippi and that there was no one intentionally or regularly sharing the Gospel with young people in these facilities. That was a year ago. Today Darron and his Assistant (and son) Jordan Byrd, along with trained volunteers are sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with teens in six of the seventeen Mississippi facilities. This year 30 incarcerated teenagers have made professions of faith through this ministry. These young people are hungry for God's Word. Volunteer Randy Mascagni says, "It's exciting to see God at work each week. Seeing lives changed and young people learn His Word for the first time speaks loudly to God's love and forgiveness available to all". Darron says that many of these children have never heard the Gospel. Many have never been to church or heard the children's Bible stories most of us are so familiar with. "This is an unengaged, unreached people group right here in Mississippi," Darron explains.

"The response by the young people is overwhelming," Darron continues. Over 95%

of the teenagers who fill out a survey request one-on-one meetings to talk about Jesus. Volunteer Mary Sanders shares, "It's a joy to speak with these girls each week. They are at a crisis point where they may be more open to listen to truth about God's love for them and His plans for their life." When young people make a profession of faith they are allowed to meet with Darron and his team for small group Bible study where they are learning how to study scripture and are encouraged to memorize scripture. One young man memorized over 60 verses in four months! His team also works to meet with each of the teens who request a personal meeting.

God has richly blessed this new ministry and is growing it much more quickly than we anticipated. Consequently, there is a real need for additional partners to be trained and take the Gospel to this unreached group of young people. All volunteers are provided comprehensive training to equip them for this ministry that they believe God is calling them to.

Since many of these teenagers are released and feel their only choice is to return to the only family and friends they have known, we have an extraordinary need for partner churches to provide mentoring and connectivity for them. Aftercare is a key component to helping these new Christians be successful in navigating their new life in Christ. The battle between their new life and their former life is real and most of them are not at all equipped for the battle.

More Volunteer Training

Legislative Updates

The Baptist Children's Village (BCV), along with national partner CORE (Coalition For Residential Excellence) and state partner MACCA (Mississippi Association of Child Care Agencies) continue to be heavily involved in legislative debates advocating for safety and quality provision for children in Mississippi and throughout America. BCV Executive Director Sean Milner and Director of Programs Charlie Rogers just returned from Washington DC where they met with Congressional leaders to secure their support for HR 3852 and opposition to HR 2955 and its companion S 1351.

HR 3852 Create Accountable Respectful Environments (CARE) for Children Act is a bipartisan national effort to safely provide for more hurting children and to help secure the BCV's right to do what we do. Previous legislation like the Families First Prevention Services Act was but one of the attempts to remove our ability to care for children. They were unsuccessful in their attempts to thwart the ministry of the BCV because, due to the extraordinary generosity of our donors, we were not dependent on any government dollars for our services. HR 3852 however, is our attempt to reestablish our right to provide quality care for hurting children and families; and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with each one of them. Congressmen Michael Guest and Mike Ezell have already signed off on this bill. Please contact them and let them know how much you appreciate their leadership in protecting children. Please also contact Bennie Thompson and Trent Kelly and ask them to join their colleagues in supporting HR 3852 and be a part of meaningful legislation that protects our vulnerable children and your BCV's right to serve them. You will want to know that Sean A. Milner, BCV's executive director, helped draft this bill.

Senator Rick Scott in Florida is considering dropping a companion bill in the Senate so please ask your Senators Roger Wicker and Cindy Hyde-Smith to contact Rick Scott's office and join him in sponsoring this important legislation.

We can also use your help in defeating HR 2955 and companion bill S 1351 entitled "Stop Institutional Child Abuse Act. This bill does not, in fact, "stop institutional child abuse" or acknowledge that many agencies like your BCV provide safely for hurting children. Please let Senators Wicker and Smith know how much you appreciate their acknowledgement that they will NOT vote for this bill. Please also contact your congressmen to thank them for not voting for this dangerous bill that would empower the US Health and Human Services Director to appoint nine people from nine departments in Washington to spend three years to return and tell Congress what should be put into law as to how we are to operate. Currently, your BCV is free to make decisions that we feel are healthiest for the children and families we serve. We appreciate your help in ensuring that we continue to enjoy that freedom.

David recalls, "The home I have built with my wife and three children in New Albany, Mississippi sits in stark contrast to the life I knew growing up where there was constant shouting, and even gun fights between my mother and father. I was surrounded by anger from a very young age and grew to be a bitter, angry teenager. I had no dreams or expectations of even graduating high school."

Martha shares 1 Corinthians 13:13 that says, "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." She explains that this scripture is so important for a wife, parent, mentor, friend, or family and that, "hope and prayer give courage to know tomorrow can be a better day."

David came to know the Lord while a teenager living at The Baptist Children's Village and, though he struggled to do so, he graduated high school, and later earned a college degree in business administration. Today David is a successful businessman and a current and longtime member of the Board of Education for the city of New Albany.

The national Catherine Hershey Awards Program was launched in 2005 with a specific focus on residential education. The awards program is sponsored by the Milton Hershey School and is administered by CORE (Coalition of Residential Excellence). This prestigious award was presented at the Awards Luncheon at the 2023 CORE Conference held in September in Chamberlain, South Dakota. Martha reflects, "It was a wonderful event and David was so honored. I had never heard of CORE. It is such a mission to work with and help these schools and homes."

The Baptist Children's Village and CORE continue to be strong partners in the efforts to ensure excellence in residential childcare nationwide.

Passed in 2019 by the MS Legislature, the Children's Promise Act allows business owners to receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit of up to half their MS tax liability by gifting that portion to an Eligible Charitable Organization (ECO) like The Baptist Children's Village. Individuals may receive a tax credit of up to \$3,000 if filing jointly (\$1,500 filing single).
